PROGRAM OVERVIEW The Social Entrepreneurship and Accelerator Program is a joint collaboration between JAIMS and the University of Hawai'i—West O'ahu. The semesterlong program is designed to provide participants with fundamental skills and knowledge in starting a venture with an underlying social and cultural relevance and impact. In addition, the program aims to provide participants an understanding of the innovation culture in Hawai'i.







Learning Outcomes

Together with UH - West O'ahu, JAIMS aims to assists participants in:

- Understanding Start-up Lifecycle and gaining an inside look at Hawaii accelerators,
- Expanding cultural perspectives, environmental challenges, and opportunities,
- Promoting global thinking, innovation, and inquiry through experiential learning, and
- Contributing to community development through a CAPSTONE project.

Since 1976, the University of Hawai'i - West O'ahu has served the people of Hawai'i and re-



PROGRAM CURRICULUM



Courses

• BUSA 335: Social Entrepreneurship (3 credits) -UH West Oahu

This course will examine the role of entrepreneurial thinking in social value creation.

Students will learn basic entrepreneurial skills from the perspective of social change agents. Additional topics include identifying social injustices, planning sustainable ventures, and measuring social impact.

 Application of the creative process to problems encountered in developing a new product, service, or organization. The course will allow students to practice their problemsolving skills, design thinking, and learn about creative organizations.

- Mind-mapping and Systems Thinking

- Product Design and Engineering
- Problem Solving and Decision Making

The program will also include the following:

- Site Visits (Accelerators, Start-up Labs, Manoa Innovation Center, American Red Cross, Habitat for Humanity, Aloha United Way, et cetera)
- Workshops
- Capstone Project



PROGRAM DELIVERY

Duration: 6 weeks (1 summer session)

Time frame: July 5th - August 12th (3 days a week M-W-F, 9:00 - 12:00 pm)

First 3 weeks @ UH West Oahu, Second 3 weeks @ JAIMS



PROGRAM COST

- Tuition
 - For credit: \$ 2,500 (3 credits) includes all school fees (*Except books)
 - For non-credit: \$ 1,900
- Lodging (Transportation will be provided to bus students between UHWO and JAIMS)
 - Dormitory in Hawaii Tokai: \$ 50/night (first 3 weeks)
- Homestay in Hawaii Kai: \$ 900 for 3 wks. (second 3 weeks)
